


After a few weeks off, Billy and the #86 team made their return to Flamboro Speedway on Saturday for Meet the Drivers night, which is always popular not only with the fans but with drivers and teams alike. Practice was spent scuffing new tires for the race on July 5th with practice times being much slower than usual, due to the heat and humidity. The team struggled with the original set of left-side tires and the second set of right-side tires not coming up their preferred stagger that was required to make the car turn through the corners.



Two more cars joined the field for the night, so the track made the decision to run one single thirty lap feature instead of the standard twin twenty-five lap features with group qualifying setting the starting positions for the race. On his final lap Billy laid down a time of 15.558 seconds to win the pole, narrowly edging out the #27 of Kevin Albers who had run a fast time of 15.576 seconds the lap before. After qualifying, Billy loaded up the #86 with hero cards and box full of chips as he made his way to the front straightway for an autograph session as part of Meet the Drivers night. The autograph session always gives the fans the chance to see the cars up close and meet their favorite drivers.



The pro late model feature was the last race of the night as they took to the track with the #86 leading the way. The field took the green flag with the #86 running side by side with the #27 of Albers over the first couple of laps before the caution came out early for the #68 of newcomer Darren Jones who had spun down the back straightaway. Darren had spent a couple of years running at Peterborough Speedway before deciding to run at Flamboro for the remainder of the 2025 season. As has been the story for the start of the season, the #86 would take a few laps before getting up to speed, which meant Billy was going to have to do some defensive driving for the first few laps before the car came to life. The field came to green on the restart as again the #86 and the #27 did battle side by side for several laps before Billy was able to get out front of the #27 to move into the lead. The #27 was not making easy as he was able to get his nose right to the back bumper of the #86 but he was unable to take advantage and make any moves. As the laps ticked by, Billy started to pull away from not only the #27 but the rest of the field as he led flag to flag to bring home his fourth feature win of the season.
